Dolly Parton's music and humour have been part of so many people's lives. You can play a short excerpt from a licensed music source between a few questions if that suits your group, or simply use the quiz as a relaxed table activity.

How to Use This Dolly Parton Quiz in Aged Care

Print the questions or read them from a tablet. I find it works best to ask one question at a time, then give residents a chance to answer, listen, or simply enjoy the chat around the table. There is no need to hurry through all 20 questions. If a song title opens up a good conversation, stay with it for a moment.

All of the answers are directly below the questions, so you can easily check them as you go.

Gentle Dolly Parton Reminiscing Prompts

You do not need to ask every prompt. I would choose one or two that feel right for the group and let the conversation take its own direction.

- Which Dolly Parton song title do you enjoy most?
- Did you ever listen to country music on the radio, at home, in the car, or while doing jobs around the house?
- What did country-music singers often wear when you were younger—cowboy boots, bright shirts, hats, or something else?
- Did you ever see 9 to 5 or Steel Magnolias at the cinema or on television?
- What was your usual workday routine? Did you have a favourite tea break, lunch, uniform, or way of travelling to work?
- Do you enjoy a singer with a strong sense of humour?
- What colours or patterns would you choose for a bright “coat of many colours” collage?
- Would you rather listen to country music, dance music, a film soundtrack, or something else during an activity session?

A Simple Way to Finish the Session

If the group would like to continue, play one short Dolly Parton song from your usual licensed music source and invite people to enjoy it in their own way. You could also place a few bright flowers or patterned scarves on the table and offer tea. Keep the ending gentle—there is no need to turn the room into a stage set.
